This Request for Information (RFI) is issued solely for informational purposes and does not constitute a Request for Proposal (RFP), Request for Quotation (RFQ), or invitation for bid.

B. Purpose

1. The purpose of this RFI is to obtain input from industry to help inform the NCIA's acquisition planning. Responses to this RFI will assist in refining requirements, identifying capabilities, and shaping the strategy for any future solicitation.

1. Background


The NATO Communications and Information Agency (NCIA) is committed to providing a safe and healthy work environment in compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and standards, including ISO 45001 and the NATO Occupational Health and Safety (OH&S) Policy. To strengthen OH&S governance, ensure operational compliance, and reduce preventable incidents, NCIA requires a multi-year contracted support arrangement for professional OH&S services across multiple Agency locations.

This capability support the NCIA's mission to ensure and maintain a safe work environment across the NCI Agency, in which the Agency, together with its entire staff, can deliver its Mission, support its customers, and pursue its business ends and objectives without disruption and harm. The Occupational Health and Safety Team strives to protect all staff by effectively managing Health and Safety by preventing accidents, injuries, and occupational illnesses.

2. Scope

The Contractor shall provide qualified Health & Safety professionals/ services to deliver services at the assigned NCIA locations, including but not limited to:

- Agency OH&S Strategy Implementation & Compliance: Assist in implementing, monitoring, and reviewing OH&S policies, strategies, procedures, and guidance to ensure alignment with the Agency OH&S Strategy and ISO 45001;
- Risk Assessment & Inspections: Conduct planned and ad-hoc OH&S inspections, hazard identification, and risk assessments for assigned locations;
- Incident Investigation: Lead or support investigations of accidents, near-misses, and unsafe conditions, producing reports with root cause analysis and corrective action recommendations at assigned locations;
- Training & Awareness: Support development and deliver H&S training, toolbox talks, and awareness campaigns tailored to operational needs for assigned locations;
- Performance Monitoring: Support the local collection and analysis of OH&S KPIs, feeding into the Agency-wide OH&S performance reporting;
- Advisory Services: Provide on-site and remote advisory support to Agency management at the assigned locations and to CQO centrally, on OH&S matters;
- Others as deemed necessary to ensure the full implementation of the NCIA OH&S Strategy at the assigned locations.

3. Objectives

The purpose of this Statement of Work (SOW) is to define the scope, work packages, deliverables, responsibilities, and timeline for Multi-Year Support Contract – Health & Safety Services in support of the NCIA Chief Quality Office strategic objectives linked to the Agency OH&S Strategy.

This project aims to provide the full local OH&S support at main Agency locations, to ensure systematic hazard identification, comprehensive risk assessment, and effective risk and opportunity management.

It also seeks to generate support to the competency development and strengthening of the Agency's OH&S Management System (OH&S-MS) through sustained delivery of professional services, compliance monitoring, and local training support.


