Welcome to the Greek Pilot of the eFTI4ALL Project

The Greek Pilot is one of the national demonstration sites established under the **eFTI4ALL** project, co-funded by the European Union within the Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) programme. The pilot aims to support the implementation and adoption of the **electronic Freight Transport Information (eFTI) Regulation** by testing digital information exchange between economic operators and competent authorities.

The pilot contributes to the digital transformation of freight transport by enabling the secure, efficient, and interoperable exchange of transport information across borders and transport modes.

Objectives

Greece's strategic position at the crossroads of Europe, Asia, and Africa makes it pivotal for EU trade and transport corridors. The Greek Pilot would involve integrating the eFTI infrastructure with existing digital platforms and national infrastructure, and ensuring compatibility with EU-wide systems, thereby enhancing EU's role in international supply chains.

The Greek Pilot aims to:

- Demonstrate the practical implementation of the EU eFTI Regulation in Greece.
- Test the electronic exchange of freight transport information between businesses and public authorities.

- Improve the efficiency and transparency of freight transport inspections.
 - Reduce administrative burden and paperwork for transport operators.
 - Support interoperability with other national pilots and European eFTI platforms.
 - Collect operational feedback to facilitate the future deployment of eFTI services.

Scope of the Pilot

The Greek Pilot focuses on the digital exchange of freight transport information involving relevant national authorities and logistics stakeholders.

Pilot activities include:

- Testing eFTI data sharing during transport operations.
 - Validation of eFTI platform services.
 - Evaluation of operational, technical and regulatory aspects of eFTI implementation.
 - Assessment of user experience and business benefits.
